#### ANC Supports Shady Hill Square

Residents of Shady Hill Square continue to seek support in their efforts to preserve the community's central green following its 2007 purchase by a developer who planned to build a single-owner house on what was previously common space.

Shady Hill Square residents have asked ANC to support their request for City Historic Preservation, or other Cambridge Community Preservation Act, funds that, in addition to a larger amount of privately raised funds, would allow them to purchase and preserve the central green.

Mr. Diamond composed a letter of support, which he presented to the Council. Council members voted unanimously in favor of the letter and, following the incorporation of some additions mentioned at the meeting, it will be sent to City officials.

## PORTER SQUARE POST OFFICE EXTENDS HOURS

Effective April 28, 2008, the Porter Square Post Office has extended its retail hours, remaining open until 7 PM, Monday through Friday. It is their hope that this change will provide greater access and convenience for customers who live and work in the Agassiz and Porter Square communities.

## LESLEY UNIVERSITY RECOGNIZED WITH PRESERVATION AWARD

Lesley University is being honored with a Preservation Award from the Cambridge Historic Commission for the restoration of 16-18 Wendell St., a student residence. The project, completed in 2007, joined two Victorian wood frame houses with a rear addition while refurbishing and restoring the historic charm of the houses' porches and street facing façade.

"The University is a proud steward of numerous historic buildings in Cambridge, and it's wonderful to be recognized for our efforts to give them new purpose through our academic mission, while preserving their charm and character," said Lesley University President Joseph B. Moore.

Initiated in 1997, the Cambridge Preservation Recognition Program celebrates outstanding efforts to preserve and maintain historic proper-

ties throughout the city, honoring property owners and other project participants who conserve the city's architecture and historic resources. The awards are given annually for projects completed within the previous calendar year.


Also among the Cambridge Historical Commission's honorees this year is the restoration of Blackstone Station, designed by Bruner/Cott Architects of Cambridge, whose work at Harvard's Radcliffe Gymnasium was recognized with a 2007 Preservation Award. Bruner/Cott has been engaged by Lesley University to relocate The Art Institute of Boston on the site of the former North Prospect Church in Porter Square.

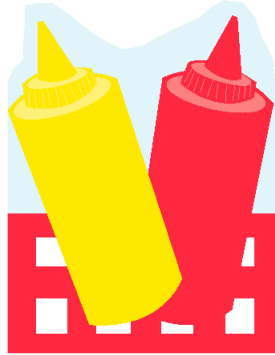
### ABC ANNUAL FAMILY BBQ
