COUNCIL MEETING

KINDERGARTEN COOPERATIVE

The next Agassiz Community Schools Neighborhood Council Meeting will be held Wednesday, Dec. 19 at 8:00 in the school library. The agenda will include the following:

1. Admissions policy to be set for the Kindergarten Cooperative Program at Agassiz
2. A report from the planning group on the ideas developed at their last meeting concerning the heavy traffic flow on Oxford St. and what the community can do to slow it down or cut it out.
3. The recent increase of crime in the area especially the two rapes in the last two weeks and what we as a community can do about it.
4. The holiday schedule and program changes after the holidays.

The Kindergarten Cooperative Program at Agassiz - a Community Schools program - is in the process of setting an admissions policy. Started last fall to provide public school kindergarteners with a session to complement the public system and extend the school day, the group has been meeting from 8:30 to 2:30 in the Community Schools room. For weeks parents in the group and others who are interested in it have been discussing the factors involved in setting a fair policy of admissions. How the group does (or should relate to the city, the neighborhood, the Agassiz School, and the Playgroup (which it grew out of) have all been considered. A flyer has just gone out to parents of
