AGASSIZ COMMUNITY COUNCIL NEWS

Minutes from the April 5th Meeting-

1. Norton's Woods - Robert Campbell,
architect for the American Academy of
Arts and Sciences spoke to the Coun-
cil about their proposed plans for
Norton's Woods. The Academy has now
chosen Norton's Woods as its prefer-
red site over sites at U. Mass, Tufts,
and the Lechmere Canal.

The activities of the Academy at
the site will consist primarily of
small meetings, according to Mr.
Campbell. There will occasionally
be meetings of the entire member-
ship. The area of the proposed
building is 38,000 square feet,
which is about half of the two acre
site which the Academy will occupy.

The remaining three acres would
be left open to the community as
park land for "passive recreation."
It could also be used by the Agassiz
summer camp program as it has been
in the past. An entrance would be
placed on the Beacon Street side to
open the area to Somerville resi-
dents. The entire park area will

be fenced and locked up at night.
The Academy will have its own
guard to patrol the property at
night.

Questions were raised about
the Academy's commitment to main-
taining the open space. Harvard
is not willing to give any written
commitment to keep the space open,
but the Academy says that it is
morally committed to keeping the
space open. Some people questioned
Harvard's past performance on "moral
commitments."

Campbell pointed out that the
Academy will require a use variance
from the Zoning Board of Appeals,
and that such a commitment could
be made a condition of the grant
of that variance. It was apparent
though that there were still prob-
lems with getting a firm commit-
ment for the preservation of the open
space.

Mr. Campbell also said that the
Academy was also willing to have a
community advisory group which
would have some input into the
planning process. This group will
contain at least one resident of
the Agassiz neighborhood and rep-
resentatives from Shady Hill and
Somerville.

2. Police Task Force - Alan Korb
suggested that we try to implement
a "neighborhood watch" program to
cut down on crime in the neighbor-
hood. It was agreed that this
would be discussed at the next
Council meeting.

SPRING MUSICIANSHIP CLASS

Martha Rogers and Cindy Cohen will be offering a second series of classes in music and movement after school on Tuesdays, starting April 25 at Sanctuary. COMMUNITY GARDEN NEWS

On April 5th, we held an organizational meeting for the Sacramento Street gardens. The turnout was high and many people expressed interest in improving the gardens this year. The following items were discussed.

1) It was agreed that each gardener would make an annual contribution of one dollar for upkeep. If you haven't done so already, this money can be given to Julie Snow or Ken Basler of the Community Schools.

2) Plans were made to construct a bulletin board and a compost bin. It was also agreed to purchase a couple of trash cans.

3) We may have access to a source of free manure this year. Plans are being made for transporting it to the gardens.

4) We may plant flower beds in the grassy area along the street. Any one interested in working on this should speak to Harry Pskowski (491-3919).

5) Soil samples have been recently taken from each plot to test for lead content. The results should be known by the time this is published. Although previous tests have shown a lead level within safety limits, the current tests will be much more thorough and complete.

6) Free packages of seeds have been made available to Community Garden through Mass. Dept. of Agriculture.
